Majesty



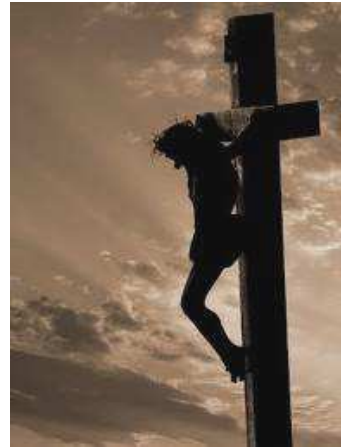
Louis XIV King of France, known as “Louis the Great,” was the longest-reigning king in European history, reigning 72 years and dying in 1715. Louis was a staunch believer in the doctrine of “The Divine Right of Kings,” which stated that God Himself stood behind earthly kings. For Louis, this meant creating a centralized government that revolved exclusively around him, as he was recorded as saying, “I am the state.” By royal power he consolidated a system of one-man rule over France that lasted until the French Revolution (1789-1799).

Few rulers in world history controlled their image like Louis. He used building projects and the arts to present himself in as grand a manner as possible. He built the magnificent Palace of Versailles as a visible display of his power. He also financed over 300 formal portraits of himself – all of which depicted him as a larger-than-life figure. One of the last of these portraits (shown above) has a 63 year-old Louis standing on a set of unnaturally young and athletic legs!

This spring as we once again witness the events of Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter and the Easter season, we can appreciate the true majesty of Jesus. It is in the darkness of the crucifixion and the brilliant light of the resurrection that God paints for us a true portrait of majesty.

Untouched by the falsification of human pride, the majesty of Jesus focuses not on the love that He expects from us but on His love taking action for us. That’s His majesty.

There are many in this day and age who are willing to judge God by their own standards. If only God would do this, or stop this, then He could be acknowledged as God and submitted to in faith. But God does not answer to our standards. Rather, He sets His own standards, defining Himself for us in the cross and resurrection of Jesus. Nowhere is God more fully revealed as worthy of our faith than in these events.



What does this mean for us? If God has so lavished His majesty upon us in Jesus’ great passion, then we can have the confidence that comes with being the objects of His love. Confident not because He has discovered our love for Him, but confident that in Christ, He has created in us what is pleasing to Him. This was Luther’s life changing breakthrough that brought him final peace with God.

The love of God... loves sinners, evil persons, fools, and weaklings in order to make them righteous, good, wise, and strong. Rather than seeking its own good, the love of God flows forth and bestows good. Therefore sinners are attractive because they are loved; they are not loved because they are attractive. (Martin Luther)

In light of what He has done for us, how should we live, now, while on this earth? Some of our new DVD's and magazines give us examples through the lives of those who are already with our Savior. Some of our older movies also give an example of how to live the Christian life. New ones are on the top shelf, and older ones below. Watch one or two and be inspired!

The First Valentine is an imaginary story about a young girl who learns from her teacher about the real Christian martyr, Valentine, and his impact on those living in ancient Rome. We celebrate Valentine's Day every year, but do you know why this saint is honored around the world? St. Patrick's Day is also celebrated with great enthusiasm, but do you know the real story of Patrick? America is the only country where it is not a religious holiday.
