From Pr. Brad...

Dominion



The history of the law enforcement agency we know today as the Texas Rangers traces its beginning back to 1823. With close to 700 families homesteading the territory of Texas, 10 men were commissioned by the territorial authority as Rangers. Their mandate was to provide law and order for the settlers. By 1837 the force had grown to 300 men.

The Rangers functioned as both law enforcement and military defense. They fought in Texas' War of Independence from Mexico and then later in the Mexican-American War. With their knowledge of terrain and tactics, combined with a fearsome reputation as fighters, they brought law, order, and peace to Texas.

Throughout the history of Texas, those who committed crimes ranging from cattle stealing to murder would have to contend with the Rangers. Through their tenacity and toughness, they extended the dominion of the Texas government to the remotest of regions. As one outlaw confessed,

The Rangers... their guns were always loaded and their aim was unerring; they slept in the saddle and ate while they rode... when they took up our trail they followed it doggedly day and night.

"Dominion" is a word that means "control" – it's based on the old Latin root "dominium"

meaning, "property ownership rights." Now that's a concept we can all relate to – when we pay for something, whether it be a hamburger, a car, or a house, it's ours and we have rights that come with ownership.

Today, as Christians, we live under the dominion of human government, and the Bible tells us that we should submit to this authority when it doesn't violate our faith. As our Lord told us, "Render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's; and to God the things that are God's" (Matthew 22:21).

Yet, there is a clear priority for us as God's children who are citizens of His eternal kingdom – He calls us to live first and foremost under His dominion. The reason for this priority is that God has not only created us, but He has also paid the price to redeem us out of our slavery to sin and death. He has "purchased" us through the suffering and death of His Son Jesus Christ and therefore has all the rights of ownership or "dominion" over us.

But, here is the good part – instead of fearing His rule, or fighting His control, we can rest in it, because His ownership is marked by His unconditional love and personal sacrifice for us. It's because of His blessed and eternal dominion won for us through Jesus Christ that He calls to cast our anxieties upon Him. We can do this knowing that He cares deeply for us. And, He reminds us that even during our trials, His dominion is in tact and our future is secure. As the Apostle Peter wrote to early Christians suffering persecution and death from a Roman government (1 Peter 5),

6 Therefore humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God, that He may exalt you at the proper time, 7 casting all your anxiety on Him, because He cares for you... 10 After you have suffered for a little while, the God of all grace, who called you to His eternal glory in Christ, will Himself perfect, confirm, strengthen and establish you. 11 To Him be dominion forever and ever.
