URGENT PRAYER REQUEST

I assume that the vast majority of you are aware of the section of Scripture normally entitled “The Armor of God.” Nestled at the end of Ephesians 6, Paul gives a list of various pieces of armor that are specifically designed to protect Christians against all forces of evil. These are designed to be offensive weapons; there’s no weapon for my back because I’m always facing the enemy. I find it fascinating that after the list of the armor is given, and its requisite function, Paul ends this section of Ephesians 6 by speaking of “praying at all times in the Spirit with all prayers and supplication” (verse 18). Moreover, to that end, he says that we are to “...keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints,” (verse 18). Then, in verse 19, he becomes very personal and very specific because he asks for an urgent prayer request for himself, “and also for me, that words may be given to me and opening my mouth boldly to proclaim the mystery of the gospel.” This is an incredibly powerful statement. Paul is the greatest evangelist the world has ever seen. He is, humanly speaking, one God has used in an unparalleled fashion to reach millions as well as the one who God used to author the majority of the New Testament. He could almost be credited as single-handedly perpetuating the gospel like no one else, before or since, and even with this very impressive résumé, Paul is very quick to ask people to intercede for him. He recognizes the unique value in the very Spirit of God anointing individuals, including himself, that each time he opens his mouth he will be able to boldly proclaim the Good News of Christ.

How many words per day do you speak? I read in a relational book that men speak, on average, about 6000 words during their working day. At the end of their working day, they’re pretty much done speaking for the day. Women, on the other hand, speak about the same amount of words during their working day, but by no means have they at that point exhausted their ability to communicate at a substantive level. (There’s a joke in here somewhere, but I’m not going to touch it.) In all seriousness, how often do you open your mouth? You open it to speak, to eat, brush your teeth, and cough. In the book of James chapter 3 verse 10 it says that out of the same mouth comes both blessing and cursing. This is a crazy phrase to me. Paul is talking about every single time he opens his mouth, every single time he utters a sentence, his prayer is that each time he will speak first with boldness and to speak with clarity. He recognizes that in the next phrase he uses that there is a mysterious element to gospel proclamation. Whenever Paul uses the word gospel, he’s using a borrowed phrase from the secular culture in which he came. That phrase came to be understood as “good news.” This is in fact, great news of what Jesus has done for all. So what’s the mystery? Whenever you choose to proclaim the Gospel, you will inevitably encounter mysterious elements. For example, a Christian is someone who is “declared” not created. No one is created as a Christian. We are actually created in the image of God, but having fallen from grace, we are a member of the fallen creation, meaning that we’re actually an enemy of God, not a friend. Romans 8:17 uses the word enmity when speaking of our resistance to God. There is much mystery as it relates to why some people are so quick to embrace Christ and others are so resistant. Paul again here is asking for personal prayer because he understands the importance of his mission. It is of great value to know how important the Gospel proclamation is and how easy it is to make mistakes. He’s really praying to be anointed so that every single conversation he has will become a divinely appointed moment where the hope of the gospel can be shared, and life can be declared in the name of Christ.

In light of this passage, I can’t help but to make a personal application. In the same manner, to ask you to pray for me in a very similar way. I would never put myself on the same plane as the apostle Paul, but I do believe that all people are called, at some level or another, to be a witness for Christ. Romans chapter 10 speaks of the inability to believe if they’ve never heard the gospel and how are they to hear without someone preaching (verse 14). This necessitates proclamation. Whoever you are. Wherever you are. For someone to become a Christian means someone else has opened their mouth to speak the Gospel to them. In a very Paul-like fashion, I think there’s great value in us asking for others to pray for us so that every single time we open our mouths we will not only share the Gospel, but we will do it boldly.

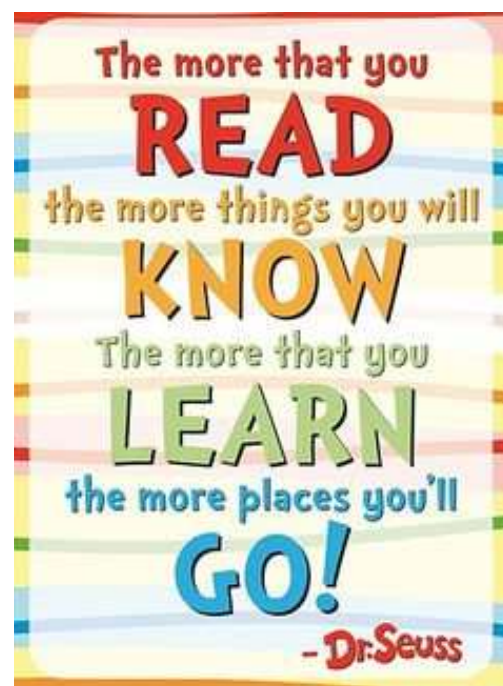
Time for School

It's time to get your "thinking caps on" along with your sneakers and sweaters. The temperatures are getting cooler (maybe) and the majority of us will be harvesting, canning, or thinking about football. A few will already be planning Thanksgiving or Christmas. Students will be wishing for easy teachers and a best friend in their class. Only a few of us will be thinking about books. For those people, we have new ones. Most of our new donated books are for children, but one is for adults, and two are for older children and adults. I hope you will find one of them helpful or entertaining as the days get shorter and the nights get longer.

Six books are for younger children, and you will find them on the nursery bookshelf or on the lower shelves near Fellowship Hall. ***Jonah***, illustrated by Roger Audette, is a rhyming board book. ***Counting God's Creatures*** and ***ABC Animals***, by Jan Mecklenburg, are a great way to help little ones learn skills while you read to them and they look at the realistic illustrations. ***The Case of the Lost Temper*** by Doug Peterson, a Veggie Tales book teaches a lesson in self-control. Small children often wish every day was Christmas. You can give them a touch of it now with two of our new illustrated books. ***Room for a Little One: A Christmas Tale***, by Martin Waddell and illustrated by Jason Cockcroft begins with the arrival of several animals to the stable one-by-one. Then a woman and a man arrive. During the night, the animals welcome the newborn baby, Jesus. ***Away in a Manger*** illustrated by Thomas Kinkade, has illustrations that go with two verses of the song.

We have patriotic and history books still on the shelves for America's birthday. One book arrived late, so it was added this month. ***Red, White, Blue, and Uncle Who? Stories Behind Some of America's Patriotic Symbols*** by Teresa Bateman and illustrated by John O'Brien, is a fact-filled book for both older children and adults. There are some things we were never taught in school. For example, what do you know about the Great Seal of the United States? What is it? Where is it kept? Why do we have one? What do the symbols mean?

Two books concern spiritual things. First, ***The Anatomy of Sin*** written and illustrated by Sara Ronnevik, is perfect for reading with your older child or grandchild. Sara has included three topics: Part I The Origin and Pathology of Sin, Part II Sin and the Body, and Part III Overcoming Temptation. You can check it out from our library, or you can download it for free as a PDF at minnesotatrue.blog on the post titled "The Anatomy of Sin." ***The second book is As it is in Heaven: How Eternity Brings Focus to What Really Matters***, by Greg Laurie. Pastor Laurie looks at verses speaking of heaven to learn what we will actually see and hear in Heaven. Then he draws conclusions about how the facts about Heaven need to impact our lives.

Mission of the Month

The Andrews Family

This month, we have the opportunity to come alongside Kari and Brent Andrews from Fergus Falls and their family as they walk through a particularly challenging season of life.

The past several months have brought medical, financial, and personal difficulties for the Andrews family. In June, Kari underwent a complete hysterectomy after being diagnosed with early-stage uterine cancer. She is now on a journey of recovery, gradually regaining her strength and stamina. Thankfully, her pathology results showed that surgery was the only treatment recommended at this time—a blessing for which Kari and Brent are very grateful. She will continue to have regular follow-up appointments over the next several years.

Kari is a registered nurse by profession but is currently a stay-at-home mom, caring for their two sons, Hunter (12) and TJ (10). Brent works at the Lutheran Brethren Seminary in Fergus Falls and also serves as an Associate Pastor at Messiah Lutheran Church of rural Underwood.

In addition to caring for their own family, Kari and Brent have also been helping their parents with various needs and medical appointments. Sadly, Brent's father passed away in July, adding another layer of loss to an already difficult season.

With Kari unable to work and the family relying on a single income while medical expenses continue to arrive, the Andrews family would be deeply grateful for the prayers and support of the congregation at Grace.

Pastor Steve, the teachers, and the Board of Education is busy with trying to figure out ways to keep the music going, and the Christmas Program!

Opening Gathering in the Sanctuary

As is our cherished tradition, all Sunday School students will gather in the Sanctuary upon arrival. This opening session will set a joyful tone for the day, featuring:

- **Worship and Singing:** Engaging hymns and lively birthday songs to celebrate special milestones.
- **Prayer and Fellowship:** A time for communal prayer and connection, fostering a sense of belonging among students.
- Sounds like this year, students will continue to learn the Books of the Bible and possibly the Lord's Prayer!

Following this gathering, students will proceed to their respective classrooms for continued learning and fellowship.

First Day of Sunday School: September 13, 2026

The inaugural Sunday will focus on building relationships and establishing a foundation for the year:

- **Classroom Introductions:** Students will meet their teachers and classroom helpers, participating in icebreaker activities to get to know one another. These activities will encourage camaraderie and create a supportive learning environment.
- **Joint Worship Participation:** All classes will reconvene during the worship service to perform a special song, uniting the Sunday School community in praise.
- **Post-Service Fellowship:** Following the service, families are invited to join us for a communal meal, featuring an abundance of food and opportunities for fellowship. This event will strengthen our community bonds and provide a warm welcome to the new Sunday School year.

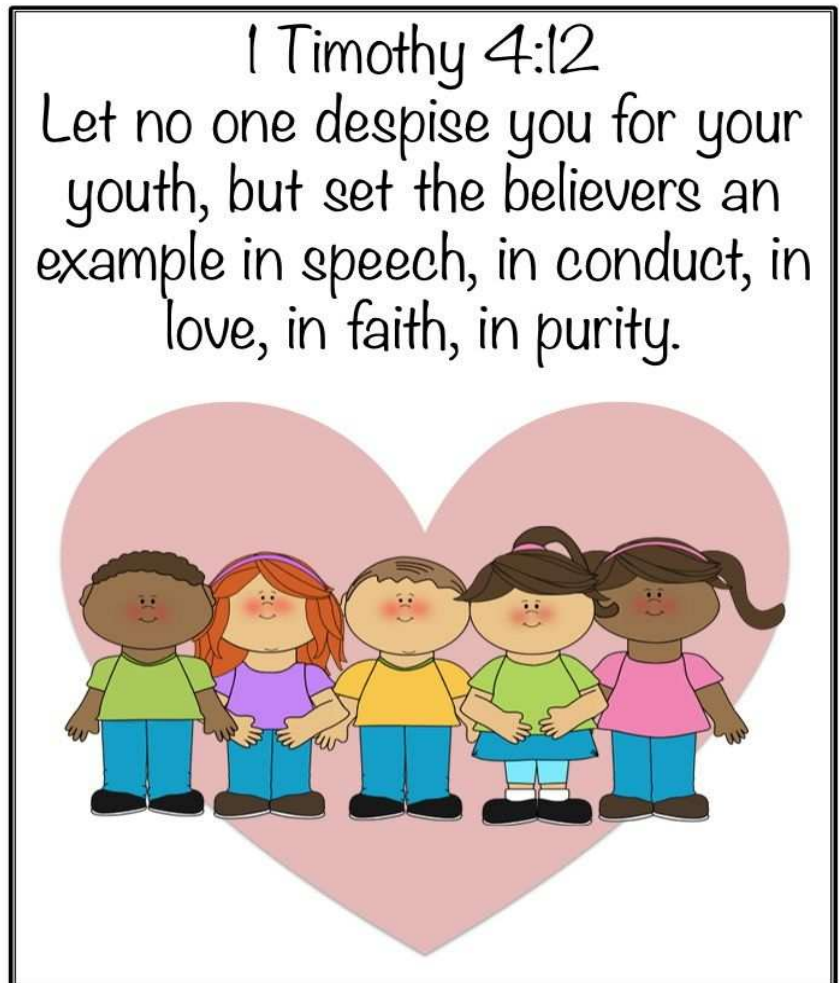
